

We all have the same rights as each other

Should anyone be treated any differently?



No – everyone should be treated equally and free from discrimination



What are the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities

These are the human rights that you have that should be protected





Your Rights



BEING EQUAL:

You have the right to be treated the same as anyone else.

Free from discrimination.



EQUAL RIGHTS FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES:

Women and children with disabilities must have their rights protected.

Must be treated the same as anyone else.



COMMUNITY AWARENESS:

Governments should teach the community about the rights and needs of people with a disability.

This is called community awareness raising.



ACCESS:

You have the right to be able to get into buildings, be able to get on trams, buses and other transport, and to get information in ways that you understand.



RIGHT TO LIFE:

Everyone has the right to life including people with a disability.

Getting the right medical treatment to help when you are sick.



SAFE IN EMERGENCIES:

You have the right to get help in an emergency, such as a bushfire.



EQUALITY IN LAW:

You have the same legal rights as anyone else.



EQUAL JUSTICE:

You should be treated the same as anyone else if you go to Court.



TO BE FREE AND SAFE:

You have the right to be free and safe. You can not be locked up just because you have a disability.



NOT TO BE TORTURED OR TREATED CRUELLY:

You have the right not to be treated cruelly or abused.

You also have the right to be safe in your house and your community.



PROTECTION FROM VIOLENCE AND ABUSE:

You also have the right to be safe in your house and your community.



RESPECTED AS A PERSON FIRST:

You have the right to be respected for who you are.



MOVE TO DIFFERENT AREAS AND COUNTRIES:

You have the right to identify with and have a Nationality.

You have the right to leave and come back into your country if you want to.



LIVE INDEPENDENTLY IN THE COMMUNITY:

You have the right to live in the community and have the same rights, choices and opportunities as anyone else in the community.



SUPPORT TO MOVE ABOUT:

You have the right to get the support you need to help you move about in the community.




FREEDOM OF SPEECH AND THE RIGHT TO INFORMATION:

You have the right to say what you want and to get information in ways you can understand.



PRIVACY:

You have the right to privacy and for other people not to know your business if you do not want them to.



RIGHT TO FAMILY AND RELATIONSHIPS:

You have the right to get married, have your own home and to have your own family if you want to.



EDUCATION:

You have the right to a good education.




GOOD HEALTH SERVICES:

You have the right to get the support you need to stay healthy.



GOOD SERVICES:

You have the right to good services to help you live a good life, including health, work, education and social services.



RIGHT TO WORK:

You have the right to work, get equal pay and to be treated equally at work.



GOOD STANDARD OF LIVING:

You have the right to live well including getting food, clothing, a place to live and clean water.



BE INVOLVED IN POLITICS:

You have the right to vote, and to be involved in politics.



SPORT AND LEISURE:

You have the same right as anyone else to take part in sports and leisure activities in the community.
